Protect your jewellery:

- Burglaries often happened around religious or cultural festivals, weddings and special occasions so be extra careful around these times.
- Be discreet when wearing jewellery in public to avoid attracting unwanted attention.
- Keep special occasion jewellery and other valuables in a safe deposit box. If you elect to keep it at home invest in a good quality safe that complies with insurance rating standards. Don't leave it on display.
- Make sure your insurance is up to date and keep a written record of all your Jewellery. Take photographs for insurance and recovery purposes.
- Ensure your jewellery is property marked with an appropriate product for use on jewellery. Any jewellery with a unique serial number can be registered for free at www.immobilise.com



Many of the measures that help prevent the theft of family gold are also useful in preventing general burglaries. In addition to the specific advice around jewellery you should also consider the following...

- Keep doors and windows locked even when you are in. Ensure keys out of reach of doors, windows and cat-flaps.
- Use a timer switch on lights to make you home look occupied. When on holiday ask a trusted neighbour to remove post and open/close curtains.
- Join your local Neighbourhood Watch scheme If there isn't one, would you consider starting one?
- If you have a burglar alarm make sure you use it, even if you're only going out for a short time.
- Don't advertise that you are attending functions or going on holiday and be particularly careful about the information you share on Social Media sites.
- Be aware that thieves sometimes ring the doorbell. Don't be tricked into letting offenders into your home and refuse access to anyone who hasn't made a prior appointment. Report any suspicious callers to the Police.
- Tidy Up Items left lying around the garden make a burglar's life easier. Make sure ladders are secured and there are no bricks lying around.
