Targeted Activity

- Four simultaneous section 8 search warrants were executed at addresses in Farnworth, Bolton by NCT (Neighbourhood Crime Team), TAU (Tactical Aid Unit) and other Bolton specialist departments. Five males were arrested on suspicion of conspiracy to steal motor vehicles and handling stolen goods. Four males were charged for conspiracy to commit theft of motor vehicles. Two were remanded in custody Josh JACKSON (15/08/91) and David SHEPLEY (18/06/79), two were released on tagged court bail Connor FISHER (22/01/03) and Christian JACKSON (24/11/80), and one was put on precharge bail Luke ROTHWELL (28/05/91).

Problem Solving

 A Section 34 Dispersal Order was implemented across Farnworth Town Centre on Saturday 1 February. This was authorised in response to increasing reports of anti-social behaviour (ASB) and large gatherings in the area. We want to ensure that those visiting and working in the area can do so without experiencing ASB or disorder.

The order was authorised to avoid large groups gathering and engaging in ASB. It remained in place from 19:00 – 01:00 on Sunday 2 February.

Bolton South neighbourhood team

Officers from Bolton South neighbourhood team secured a two-year CBO (Criminal Behaviour Order) against a prolific shoplifter frequenting in both Bolton town centre and Breightmet Retail Park.

Tackling illegal tobacco and illicit vapes

Bolton's Neighbourhood Teams joined partners on Monday 3 February to seize nearly one hundred canisters of nitrous oxide in addition to cannabis, illegal tobacco, and illicit vapes in a day of action. The group, which included local officers, trading standards, immigration officials, the fire service, and specialist sniffer dogs carried out the searches at six premises on Derby Road, Bolton, including restaurants, shops, and takeaways.

The activity was carried out to ensure that work was being conducted legally and within the confines of their licenses. This included dealing with reports of illegal activity that have come in from the local community, such as ASB, suspected drug-related criminality in the area, and more.

Immigration officials checked the legality of workers, police dogs checked for illegal tobacco and cash hordes, and the fire service checked to ensure buildings were adhering to the appropriate health and safety rules.

The day resulted in numerous positive results, including the recovery of 97 canisters of nitrous oxide gas from two vehicles which were identified by the sniffer dog team. In addition, a quantity of cannabis in snap bags was located, as well as illicit vapes which do not conform to UK standards. All were seized by police and trading standards.

Bolton West neighbourhood team

A section 8 search warrant was executed by the West Neighbourhood Team at an address in Westhoughton, as a direct result of intelligence received. During the search, boxes of cannabis / large amounts of THC vapes and a large amount of cash and designer watches were seized from the property with the occupant arrested and subsequently bailed.
